- **Introductions and information share (all)**

Meeting started at 1:05pm

- **Review/Discuss extracting Taxing District information from the County Tax Code data.**

John Prychun was able to extract 30+ taxing district boundaries from the County Tax Code data. This data includes city limits and school district boundaries. Bill Clingman is going to review the school districts and compare that with what he has for Lane County. Chad Crockett compared the city limits data with what is being produced at ODOT and mentioned there are a few discrepancies but overall it seems to be very similar. Further steps are needed to find potential other users of the data.

- **Should administrative boundaries that include Oregon's shoreline standardize on the CUSP representation from NOAA?**

The Continually Updated Shoreline Product (CUSP) is produced by NOAA.

Things to consider are that the CUSP is a dynamic layer, based on high water line. The CUSP is available only on outer coast line, not in estuaries and bays.

DLCD has used the same method that NOAA used to produce a shoreline data set for estuaries and bays. This data set was merged with the CUSP to create a more complete shoreline data set. Tanya mentioned that there is a Shoreline Workgroup that will be begin meeting regularly again. <http://www.coastalmarinedata.net/workgroups/shorelines/>

- **Tribal Boundaries**

Currently OSDL does not have a tribal boundary layer posted. There are several variations of tribal boundaries and several different sources, including the Census Bureau, Bureau of Indian Affairs, and BLM. Bob Denouden said he would compare the BIA data set with the BLM lands data set. One of those two sources should be chosen by the FIT to represent the framework element. Bob will report his findings once he has looked at the data.
