3. GEO/OGIC Update

- GIS Day – Won’t be doing anything this year, but DAS GEO will sponsor an event next year at the capitol during the legislative session. There are internal events happening at many agencies as well as events put on around the state. So, look for an event in your area. There is a large event going on in the Portland area.

- OGIC update – The next OGIC meeting will be held on 10/25, the day after the Framework Forum, from 10 am – 2 pm (working lunch) at the ODFW campus in Salem. This will be an in-person event only, no virtual options planned. This is to encourage the OGIC member to participate. There may be a call-in option for listening only.

  - GEO update (Dave Mather): the “FTP Directory” is still available, this is the site where people access content. The “WFSFTP” software needs to be updated to protect it against vulnerabilities, but after the update was installed, it stopped functioning. Will be conducting a reinstall over the next couple days. It should not be affecting webservice.

    - Thom York (DOR) presented a survey that the Cadastral FIT is planning to send out to state users regarding the tax lot data that DOR collects from the county Assessor’s and is distributed by DAS GEO.
    - Phil McClellan (DOR) gave a brief history of the Cadastral Data Exchange Standard that was originally adopted by OGIC in 2006 and last updated in 2012. He pointed out that there are a lot of dated references in the standard and that it needs to be updated. So, he is asking for input, via the Survey 1-2-3, about how state agency users use the data and if there is anything they would like to add to the tables.
    - Thom will be sending out the survey in the next few weeks and ask that you please complete the survey and pass it along to any other users within your agency.
  7. Round Table
    - BizOregon: There is a new broadband mapping tool went live in August on their website.
    - State Lands: They are also using a ticketing software for all IT request, which includes GIS request. It has been working very well. They have also completed their conversion to ArcGIS Pro.

- Agriculture: Working on completing their GIS Strategic Plan. Closing out their “field season.” Their “pest management” system is moving from in-house built to Field Maps.
- LPro: Wanted to thank everyone for replying to their emails about tracking down data layers.
- ODOT: They are in the planning phase for migrating to ArcGIS Enterprise and are updating their “platform” for TransGIS layer.
- OEM: Posted links to their grants for “response equipment solutions” purchasing. This allows local jurisdictions to get OEM to purchase equipment. They are also preparing for the upcoming solar eclipse, they have a web page that displays their plans for the event.
- State Parks: Outdoor recreation standards group has a draft standard that will be shared with the community.
- Marine Board: They have a project tracker that updates their electronic Boaters exam. They are using a project tracker in Survey 1-2-3.
- Water Resources: GIS department is in IT and they use “Halo” ticking for their work. They are still using ArcMap, and are looking for more training to help migrate to ArcPro.
