2. GEO/OGIC Update: David Mather, GEO

- a. Community org is not a place to create content. Contents stored in the org have been removed. GEO will purchase a new block of credits to fix current community org credit depletion. This issue occurred due to users storing and publishing content to the community org instead of the main AGOL org as intended.
  - i. Esri is willing to add a contractor position to the main org for them to create and store content if it's State of Oregon related. Contact DAS GEO if interested. Agencies will have to pay for contractor AGOL accounts sponsored by the agencies.

- e. Standards in progress
  - i. Addresses, building footprints FIT mtg Monday, Nov. 18<sup>th</sup>
- 4. Address Framework Standard: Tom Elder, GEO
  - a. Address point data standard has been in progress.
  - b. The building footprint meeting will be on Monday the 18<sup>th</sup>. Message Tom Elder if interested in attending.
    - i. Then, public comment period
    - ii. Presentation to OGIC next spring
  - c. Uses include next Census, public safety, etc.
  - d. Chose NENA standard as a foundation. Addresses must be complete, consistent, unique.
  - e. Future address projects include NG9-1-1 next July, contributing to Nat'l. Address Database, and Census 2030.
- 5. Web Content Accessibility Standards (WCAG): Jessica McCall, Esri
  - a. 1.3B individuals (16% of world pop) are living with a disability
    - i. 2B by 2030 expected to use at least 1 assistive product
    - ii. >20% of web traffic could come from a person with a disability
      - 1. Including temporary and situational limitations
    - iii. Impairments can change over time
  - b. Legal requirements: US Section 508 of Rehabilitation Act, 1973; ADA Title II addresses state and local governments
    - i. WCAG are internationally recognized accessibility standards
      - 1. Compliance deadlines are in April 2026-7 depending on govt. size
      - 2. Esri is working to fit the standards, but some of it has to be done by the content creators
  - c. Accessibility in GIS
    - i. Author apps with accessibility in mind
      - 1. Convey a purpose; commit to ongoing improvements; test early and often.
    - ii. Use of color and color contrast
      - 1. Color contrast for text, images: 4.5:1
      - 2. Color contrast for graphics, polygons, points: 3:1
      - 3. Consider:
        - a. Enhanced contrast basemap – light or dark version
        - b. Accessible color ramps. Test using colorblind filters.
        - c. Purposeful symbology choices
      - 4. Tools:
        - a. WebAIM color contrast checker – online
        - b. To check for colorblind friendliness: Windows settings -> Ease of Access -> turn on color filters, and try different filters
    - iii. Meaningful sequence and headings (e.g. logical page structure on StoryMaps)

- 1. To check: Esri Accessibility Insights for Web (free extension)
    - iv. Text alternatives that serve an equivalent purpose
      - 1. Describe map but don't duplicate existing captions/map text.
    - v. Data tables – provide option to export data
