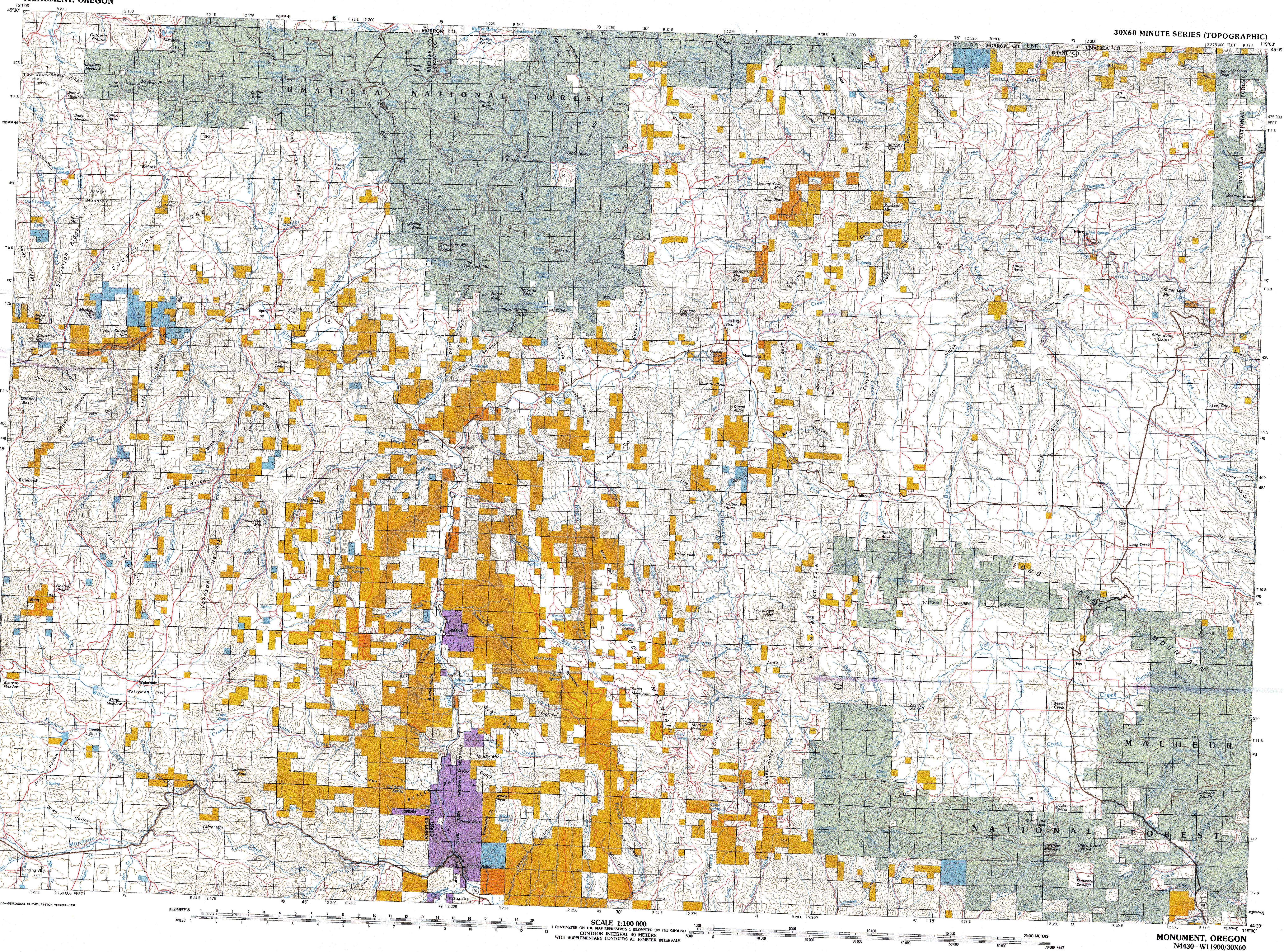
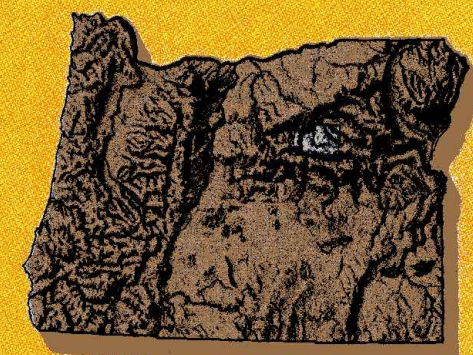

NOTE TO MAP USERS
